

## *Texas Revolution Test Study Guide*

Stephen F Austin's Arrest and Return to Texas	<p>In 1833 Austin is arrested over a letter in which he criticizes the Mexican Government.</p> <p>When he returns to TX in 1835 He is calling for Texans to fight for their rights "War is the only recourse"</p>
Battle of the Alamo	<p>William Travis, James Bowie, Davey Crockett and 189 defenders battled Santa Anna in order to give the delegates at Washington on the Brazos time to declare independence, write a constitution and raise an army.</p> <p>All of the defenders died.</p>
Constitution of 1824	<p>States' Rights Constitution of Mexico that gave states more local control.</p> <p>Santa Anna took away this constitution and became the dictator of Mexico.</p>
Battle of San Jacinto	<p>Battle at which Sam Houston and The Texas army surprised and defeated Santa Anna's Mexican Army cornering them at the San Jacinto River.</p> <p>Santa Anna is captured and Texas Gains its independence.</p>
Massacre at Goliad	<p>After Colonel Fannin surrendered his 400 men at the Battle of Coleto Creek, Santa Anna ordered they be marched out on the road and executed near Goliad.</p>
Battle of Gonzales 1	<p>Began because Texans refused to give up the cannon.</p> <p>This battle showed that Texans would fight for their rights and independence.</p>

Santa Anna	<p>President of Mexico</p> <p>Took away the Constitution of 1824.</p> <p>Led Mexican Army to Victory at the Alamo and Defeat at San Jacinto</p>
William Travis	<p>Became the Texan Commander at the Siege &amp; Battle of the Alamo.</p> <p>His letter from the Alamo encourage other Texans to fight for independence.</p>
Causes of the Texas Revolution	<p>Santa Anna's violations of the state's rights Constitution of 1824, many Texans felt that their rights were not being recognized by the Mexican Government.</p>
Texas Declaration of Independence and Date	<p>Modeled after the US Declaration of Independence.</p> <p>Written by George Childress</p> <p>Signed on March 2, 1836</p>
Sam Houston	<p>Was appointed commander of the Texas army at the Convention of 1836</p> <p>Defeated Santa Anna and won Texas Independence at San Jacinto by using geography to his advantage.</p>

Juan Seguin	<p>Commanded Tejano volunteers at the Alamo.</p> <p>Was sent to get more men and supplies. Fought with Sam Houston and the Texas Army at the Battle of San Jacinto.</p>
